



## Northern Bush Honeysuckle

### *Diervilla lonicera* Mill.

<b>Family:</b>	Diervillaceae
<b>Habitat:</b>	Mountain woodlands, bluffs, stream banks, and road banks
<b>Color:</b>	Yellow
<b>Height:</b>	2-4 ft.
<b>Exposure:</b>	Full sun to filtered shade
<b>Bloom Dates:</b>	June-Aug
<b>Soil Moisture:</b>	Well-drained
<b>Soil Quality:</b>	Rich
<b>Garden Uses:</b>	Beds and borders. Bronze green foliage.
<b>Notes:</b>	Tolerates poor conditions. Cut back in late winter for best flower production. Spreads by suckers. Self-sterile; requires pollination by insects that have travelled from another clonal patch, usually some distance away. Dependent on pollinators such as bumblebees, butterflies, and, moths.
